HAPPY EASTER

Recently, one of my friends told me about his late father, who was brought up in the 60s and 70s, when the community and church were the most important part of life. He went to church every Sunday, even weekday Masses. His faith was strong at those times when he had affective and emotive feelings about God, and then he was diagnosed with terminal cancer.

For 3 years, fighting cancer, he struggled with his faith as he often murmured 'is there a God?' However shortly before his death, at the time, most of his children were around his deathbed. He was able to say these words to his children: 'during my whole life, I have believed in God, but that isn't easy when facing death, but after 3 long years, I fought the cancer hard, and I do believe God exists. There is something beyond this world.'

We have been celebrating Holy Week - the week when the Christian Church throughout the world remembers the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus - our source of hope and salvation.

We walk through Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Good Friday reminds us of the dark side of human nature, and its association with pride, jealousy, hatred, and revenge. However, the sacrifice that Jesus Christ made for us and his resurrection, signifies the triumph of life over death, light over darkness and love over despair, selflessness over selfishness, and unity over differences.

Easter celebration reminds us that Easter Sunday comes after the darkness of Good Friday. It is time to recognize our vulnerability like the man in the above story, open ourselves to the faith that we have celebrated during this week to cherish our journey as 'Pilgrims of Hope'.

May this Easter season bring a renewed sense of hope and may the spirit of Christ's resurrection strengthen the bonds of our community. In the words of St Paul, 'Therefore, we have been buried with Him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life' (Rom 6:4:).

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

EASTER SUNDAY

Acts of the Apostles 10:34. 37-43 First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism.

God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be Alleluia! seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand.

Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 117:1-2. 16-17. 22-23. R. v.24

- (R.) This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.
- 1. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' (R.)
- 2. The Lord's right hand has triumphed; his right hand raised me up. I shall not die, I shall live and recount his deeds. (R.)
- 3. The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone. This is the work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes. (R.)

Second Reading

Colossians 3:1-4

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians.

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Alleluia, alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord.

John 20:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved.

'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.' So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
