OUR LADY STAR OF HOLY TRINITY CHURCH,

As I mark my first anniversary among you, I wish to express my sincere gratitude and joy for the privilege of serving here in our parish. It is hard to believe how quickly this year has passed. I am deeply thankful for your warm welcome and for the hospitality so many of you have shown at our weekend celebrations, over dinners and afternoon teas in your homes, and through your friendly conversations.

Celebrating this anniversary alongside our parish Peace Camino reminds me that our journey together is one of hope and faith. It is a journey of renewal and transformation.

During this month of November, we remember and pray for our deceased loved ones and for all who helped build and sustain our parish over the years. Their faith, dedication, and legacy continue to inspire us as we take up the call to build our parish for future generations.

This weekend's scripture readings remind us of the temple as the body of Christ—the Church. The prophet Ezekiel speaks of a life-giving river flowing from the temple, bringing healing and renewal wherever it goes (Ezek 47:1-2, 8-9, 12). The scriptures, as always, challenge us, yet they also bring deep comfort and hope. As we continue our journey through this Jubilee Year of Hope, let us see ourselves as pilgrims seeking inner renewal and transformation, trusting that God is truly at work within us.

In the coming months, I will be working with our Parish Pastoral Council to form a steering committee that will help us develop a parish master plan in 2026. This process will give us the opportunity to reflect on our current needs, consider our long-term goals, and listen to your ideas about the future direction of our parish. I warmly invite you to share any thoughts, concerns, or hopes you may have for our community.

This initiative is in line with the Archdiocese's Take the Way of the Gospel Framework for Parish Renewal. Take the Way of the Gospel is the Archdiocese of Melbourne's response to Pope Francis' vision of a "missionary option" (Evangelii Gaudium, §27). It invites us to come together in prayer and discernment, exploring how we can continue to grow as vibrant, vital, and faith-filled communities, so that renewed energy may enliven our parish and carry us forward with hope into the future.

As we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica today, we are reminded that we belong to one Church, united as the Body of Christ. May we remain steadfast in faith, strong in hope, and faithful in building upon the foundations laid by those who came before us.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

Ezekiel 47:1-2. 8-9. 12

A reading from the book of Ezekiel

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side. The man went to the east holding his measuring line and measured off a thousand cubits; he then made me wade across the stream; the water reached my ankles. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across the stream again; the water reached my knees. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across again; the water reached my waist. He measured off another thousand; it was now a river which I could not cross; the stream had swollen and was now deep water, a river impossible to cross. He then said, 'Do you see, son of man?' He took me Alleluia. alleluia! further, then brought me back to the bank of the river. When I got back, there were many trees on each bank of the river. He said, 'This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.'

(R.)The waters of the river gladden the city of God.

- 1. God is for us a refuge and strength, a helper close at hand, in time of distress: so we shall not fear though the earth should though the mountains fall into the depths of the sea. (R.)
- 2. The waters of a river give joy to God's city. the holy place where the Most High dwells. God is within, it cannot be shaken; God will help it at the dawning of the day. (R.)
- 3. The Lord of hosts is with us: the God of Iacob is our stronghold. Come, consider the works of the Lord, the redoubtable deeds he has done on the earth. (R.)

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 3:9-11, 16-17

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

You are God's building. By the grace God gave me, I succeeded as an architect and laid the foundations, on which someone else is doing the building. Everyone doing the building must work carefully. For the foundation, nobody can lay any other than the one which has already been laid, that is Jesus Christ.

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

Iohn 2:13-22

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins. knocked their tables over and said to the pigeonsellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market'. Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up'. The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.
