THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

The Feast of the Holy Family invites us to reflect on God's plan for family life as a place of love, care, and faithful service.

The readings for this feast remind us that the family is not only the first school of human relationships but also the foundation of spiritual growth. The first reading calls us to honour our parents, showing patience, compassion, and respect even in their weakness. Such acts are sacred gestures that bring blessing, peace, and restoration to relationships. By embracing these virtues, we participate in God's plan and allow His grace to shape the ordinary patterns of family life.

Saint Paul, in his letter to the Colossians, deepens this vision by calling Christian families to be "clothed" in compassion, humility, forgiveness, and love, reminding us that these virtues are the source of peace within our homes. The Gospel of Matthew presents the Holy Family as a living example of these principles. Joseph, Mary, and Jesus show us how faith, courage, and mutual support can guide a family through uncertainty, and daily challenges.

In this light, the Church steadily affirms the central role of the family in both Church and society. Gaudium et Spes (1965) highlights the family's social responsibilities and its place in God's plan for human life. Saint John Paul II describes the family as the "domestic Church," where parents are the first teachers of faith and daily family life witnesses to God's love (Familiaris Consortio §21). Pope Francis likewise stresses the family's importance, calling it the fundamental cell of society, where love and faith are learned and lived, shaping both ecclesial and social life (Amoris Laetitia §66).

Our celebration today reminds us that holiness can be shared within families. Though Jesus, Mary, and Joseph faced trials, their faithfulness, love, and mutual support offer a model for every family. Reflecting on the Holy Family inspires us to nurture love, respect, and fidelity in our own homes, trusting that God's grace is at work in everyday joys and challenges. Through daily acts of sacrifice and faithful commitment, each household can become a living sign of God's saving love.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

Sirach 3:2-6. 12-14

A reading from the book of Sirach/Ecclesiasticus

The Lord honours the father in his children, and upholds the rights of a mother over her sons. Whoever respects his father is atoning for his sins, he who honours his mother is like someone amassing a fortune.

Whoever respects his father will be happy with children of his own,

he shall be heard on the day when he prays. Long life comes to him who honours his father, he who sets his mother at ease is showing obedience to the Lord.

My son, support your father in his old age, do not grieve him during his life.

Even if his mind should fail, show him sympathy, do not despise him in your health and strength; for kindness to a father shall not be forgotten but will serve as reparation for your sins.

Colossians 3:12-21

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians

You are God's chosen race, his saints; he loves you and you should be clothed in sincere compassion, in kindness and humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with one another; forgive each other as soon as a quarrel begins. The Lord has forgiven you; now you must do the same. Over all these clothes, to keep them together and complete them, put on love.

And may the peace of Christ reign in your hearts, because it is for this that you were called together as parts of one body. Always be thankful.

Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you. Teach each other, and advise each other, in all wisdom. With gratitude in your hearts sing psalms and hymns and inspired songs to God; and never say or do anything except in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Wives, give way to your husbands, as you should in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives and treat them with gentleness. Children, be obedient to your parents always, because that is what will please the Lord. Parents, never drive your children to resentment or you will make them feel frustrated.

Matthew 2:13-15. 19-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

After the wise men had left, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you, and escape into Egypt, and stay there until I tell you, because Herod intends to search for the child and do away with him.' So Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, left that night for Egypt, where he stayed until Herod was dead. This was to fulfil what the Lord had spoken through the prophet:

I called my son out of Egypt.

After Herod's death, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you and go back to the land of Israel, for those who wanted to kill the child are dead.' So Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, went back to the land of Israel. But when he learnt that Archelaus had succeeded his father Herod as ruler of Judaea he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he left for the region of Galilee. There he settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way the words spoken through the prophets were to be fulfilled:

He will be called a Nazarene.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE AT HOLY TRINITY, QUEENSCLIFF

The Jubilee Year of Hope, 2025, is a time of renewal, joy, and grace for the Church worldwide and for our parish community at Holy Trinity, Queenscliff. Proclaimed by the late Pope Francis, this Jubilee invites us to rediscover the message of hope, grounded not in feelings but in the enduring promise of the Resurrection. Following Pope Francis' passing in April 2024, the Jubilee continues under Pope Leo XIV, emphasizing the continuity of the Church's mission and the universal reach of Christian hope.

At Holy Trinity Church, this Jubilee Year has provided abundant opportunities for individuals and groups to encounter Christ through prayer and reflection. Pilgrims are warmly welcomed with extended opening hours for private and group prayer, opportunities for Reconciliation, and periods of Eucharistic exposition. The church is open Tuesdays to Fridays and Sundays from 9:00am to 3:00pm, with Eucharistic exposition following the 9:15am Mass on Wednesdays and Fridays until 11:00am. The Jubilee Year will conclude on 6 January 2026.

REFLECTION

REFLECTION

All of the major themes found in today's readings highlight the relational character of family life. In Sirach some of the dynamics of family living and responsibility as exercised in the ancient world unfold before our eyes. The rewards of faithfully observing these family codes are showcased in the responsorial Psalm. Paul directs our attention to the manner of relational living to which we are summoned as members of the family of God, a manner of living that flows from the bond of perfection that unites us. The gospel narrative paints a picture of a family that follows the directives of God.

So much has been said recently about family values. But what exactly are they? The specifics of family customs and roles played within the family may be culture-bound, but it seems that the values out of which they emerge and that inform them are not. They include mutuality, respect and service between wives and husbands, between parents and children, and between the young and the old.

Mutuality, respect and service become characteristics of the Church or the ecclesial family as well. What binds the family of God together are virtues that are as relational as are the ties that bind the members of the natural family together. It may be more challenging to live out these values within the church, for those who are called to put on Christ, bearing with one another in compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience must relate in this way with people who may be strangers.
