*This is the Lamb of God
who takes away the sins
of the world
(John 1: 29)*

After the joy of Christmas, we return to Ordinary Time, a season far from "ordinary." It invites us to recognize God's presence in the daily rhythm of life, where faith is lived quietly and consistently.

Ordinary Time calls us to reflect on God's saving presence, especially amid suffering. We hold in our prayers all those affected by the recent bushfires in Victoria, offering sympathy to those who have lost loved ones, homes, livelihoods, and a sense of security. In such times, the fragility of life is laid bare, and our need for compassion and solidarity becomes ever more evident.

In moments like these, we naturally look for signs of God's presence and ask how His saving love is made real in the midst of hardship. Yet God does not usually intervene by dramatically changing circumstances or removing every hardship. More often, His providence is revealed through people, those who step forward with generosity, courage, and practical help. God's presence can be easy to overlook, but it is through these ordinary acts that His love becomes visible. Discipleship often shines most brightly not in grand gestures, but in simple, everyday actions.

The true strength of discipleship is found in the heroism of ordinary lives. They bear witness to the Gospel, becoming Good Samaritans, Simons of Cyrene, and humble servants who quietly sow the seeds of God's kingdom. Our parish exists because generations of faithful people have lived out this spirit in ordinary ways.

May this hope strengthen those who suffer and inspire us to respond with prayer, generosity, and compassion for one another. As Saint Paul reminds us, we are called to holiness and united in Christ. His greeting of grace and peace speaks powerfully today, assuring us that even in the midst of darkness, God's light can never be extinguished.

REFLECTION

Ours is an historical religion. It not only unfolds within the joys and disappointments of time and place, but it is rooted in actual events that took place in the lives of real people. The Christ to whom we commit ourselves is not a mythic character, a figment of communal religious imagination. He is someone who was born into history, at a specific period of time, in a particular place. He was known by real people like John the Baptist; he submitted himself to historical rituals like baptism. He had followers who testified to the truth of both his existence and his life. Jesus was a man of history.

Like Paul, we too have been called to be apostles. We received this call when we were baptised. The beginning of the year, with its custom of making new resolutions, is a wonderful time to remember to what we have committed ourselves. At times it seems that our own apostleship is no less daunting than was Paul's. However, it is no less immediate either. Whether the period of history is the first half of the first century, as was the time of Jesus, or the second half, as was the time of Paul, or the twenty-first century, as is our time, salvation unfolds within the events of time. Furthermore, the followers of Jesus always return to the events of his life in order to discover the meaning of the events in their lives. These past events are reinterpreted in the ongoing present. Discipleship is never otherworldly.
